I'm amazed at how quickly a year goes by. I have completed my first full year as your Interim-Pastor. And a lot has happened. We made a big financial decision to approve a 75th Anniversary Fund. Its purpose was to deal with a number of major projects at the church. Of course, the total biggest one was the makeover of the parking The Building & Grounds' team led by Cary Parke did a yeoman's job to get the project completed with new asphalt and striping and new lighting for that area.

I am grateful to the Session members and their committees for their continued faithfulness in leading the ministries here. The Deacons have, also, been faithful in caring for you and serving in worship, especially, in the preparation of our monthly Communion.

"Let's pray that God will continue to help, guide and grow us in our trust, knowledge and faith in God as we move forward into the future.

We have seen an uptick in our worship attendance, too. We held two new member classes, which I consider to be investigation classes for people who want to learn more about us as a church and then, perhaps, commit to membership--13 this past year.

I have continued on my promise to be in the pulpit every Sunday except during my vacation. I have taught an Adult Bible Study on Sunday mornings. This year it was the Book of Exodus. I am continuing in 2024 and will be teaching the Book of Galatians.

I have attended the work of the Mission Study Committee led by Tom Day along with the other members Amy Willoughby, Pastor Elaine York, and Rev Susan Taylor. They have been working diligently to get the report ready for Session approval and then, for Presbytery's Committee of Ministry.

I am thankful to God to have the joy of serving you as your Interim-Pastor. Thank you for your faithfulness. I am especially thankful for Maria and her support and wisdom and all that she contributes to our worship. Liz does a great joy handling our finances and giving good counsel to our Finance Committee. Let's pray that God will continue to help, guide and grow us in our trust, knowledge and faith in God as we move forward into the future.



It is difficult to believe that I have completed five years as your Commissioned Lay Pastor at St. John's Presbyterian Church.

My duties as outlined in my original application included: Continuing to serve on the Fellowship and Nurture Committee as Chair, working with the members to fulfill the duties assigned to them. This has included planning our Annual Congregational Potluck, our Chili Cookoff hosted by Dick and Jane Cates, Maundy Thursday Potluck, our highly successful Mother's Day Luncheon, a Father's Day Burrito Bar hosted by Maria Winchester

and serving refreshments at our Christmas Cantata to mention several.

Continuing to be an active Elder attending Session Meetings, Presbytery Meetings in the Spring and the Fall, and also being a member of Nevada Presbytery's Equipping Committee and the Committee on Representation.

Helping with Sunday Worship as invited by the Pastor. Continued to help weekly and monthly as Participating Elder and Assistant for Communion when available for the year. Also helped with Ash Wednesday's Service and organized and hosted the Blue Christmas Service with the help of seven other pastors from Northern Nevada. Participated in several Memorial Services throughout the year and officiated at a wedding in Verdi.

Continued throughout the year as a Pulpit Supply Pastor in five churches: St. John's Presbyterian, Spanish Springs Presbyterian, First Presbyterian in Virginia City, Christ Presbyterian in Gardnerville and Truckee Lutheran Presbyterian for a number of Sundays.

Have taken on some Pastoral Care duties, including calling on shut-ins, making hospital visits, staying with loved ones while they wait for their family member having surgery, delivering meals and gifts on occasion and praying with these members.

It continues to be a blessing each year for me. Continuing to support my church, St. John's, as your Commissioned Lay Pastor has been one of the most rewarding experiences of my life. It has kept me on my toes, and I appreciate the love and support that you have given me. Attending two Bible Studies and Sunday morning classes as well as completing a Hebrew Bible 12-week class at Austin Presbyterian Theological Seminary has kept me busy. Next year has begun, and, hopefully, I will continue to grow in my faith and service to you as I plan to enroll in a New Testament Class this year.



I want to say thank you to everyone for understanding my workday is never the same. This is not for the lack of trying; it just comes with the territory of being an Administrative Assistant for a church. Along with my daily duties, many needs from members, staff, committee chairs, outside groups, and random visitors have to be met. They just like to be met at separate times of the day every day.

The Building & Grounds Committee is tasked with the care of the entire church property and maintenance of all church equipment. Our meetings are on the first Monday of each month, and we welcome interested members of the church to attend and will always welcome those interested in joining us.

Below are the projects we have completed during the 2023 year:

- 1. Held Spring workday to remove weeds and leaves throughout the Church property.
- 2. Repaired all the sprinklers to operate correctly.
- 3. Installed power to the Storage Shed near the trash container to provide lights and power for tools.
- 4. Removed three fire damaged trees in the Barrett Park area.
- 5. Installed two new drinking fountains with bottle fillers--one in the SJCC and one in the Narthex.

- 6. Repaired the AC Chiller.
- 7. Signed a new contract for our cleaning service for the church building.
- 8. Signed a new contract for our snow removal for winter 2023-2024.
- 9. Installed new lighting in the parking lot.
- 10. Repayed the main parking lot, which also included replacing the concrete valley drain and restriping the lot.
- 11. Reattached the Memorial Garden wall plaques when old glue failed.
- 12. Replaced the library hallway entrance glass door that was destroyed by vandals.
- 13. Negotiated a new contract with Brotherhood Mutual Insurance for the church and SJCC's Insurance.

- 14. Replaced the old telephone system with a new upgraded system for the church and SJCC.
- 15. Negotiated a new maintenance contract with EMCOR for the HVAC system.
- 16. Approved multiple building use agreements throughout the year.
- 17. Monitored normal wear and tear on our 54-year-old building and grounds.
- 18. Negotiated an agreement with EMCOR to replace all the thermostats, electronic mother board and boiler monitoring system throughout the main part of the church building. This work is scheduled to begin in January 2024.

As you can see, it was a pretty busy year for the Building & Grounds Committee in 2023, and we expect another busy one in 2024. Below are a few projects that we will be working on this year:

- 1. Paint the Men's Bathroom in the Library hallway.
- 2. Refurbishing Barrett Park. When Rev. Bill Barrett retired, Barrett Park was established and named for him. We have a design and are in the process of getting bids for a gazebo in that area. This project will be funded entirely with gifts designated specifically for this project from the Barrett Family and others.
- 3. Trim and prune trees and shrubs seriously needed around the property.
- 4. Repair Martin Hall roof and the flat roof over the offices.

2003 started the year with a surplus of \$73,279.65 which was a terrific beginning balance. We had \$231,194.00 for the General Fund budget with 69 pledging units to give us a good start. Anticipated expenditures were \$475,596.

We ended the year with an income of

\$49,697.67, so we used \$24,082.08 of our surplus.

In January, we set March of 2023 for our Capital Campaign with Rick McElreath, Ron Scovill and George Turner serving on the Committee. As most of you know that turned into the 75th Anniversary Capital Campaign which kicked off in October of 2023. The pledge goal was set for \$450,000 and as of December 2023 \$371,000.00+ has been pledged and over \$180,000 received. We thank all of you for your support.

Our paving/lighting project was completed in the middle of September at a cost of \$345,000, and what a difference it made for a badly needed project. We are all so happy to have that done. We repurposed some of our Presbyterian Endowment Funds to pay for this—namely the New Church Development and Kintner funds. In December we repaid the New Church Development Funds \$100,000.

The Barrett Park Fund now has over \$80,000, and we hope to see a Gazebo there in the spring.

The 2024 stewardship campaign for the General Budget/Capital Improvement Fund was held later this year and gave us 52 pledges for \$224,245 (Gen. Budget) and 24 pledges for \$24,240 (Cap. Improvement). We do apologize for the lateness of the Campaign, but we have already reserved November 10, 2024 for this year's campaign.

We have received \$17.587.75 for various unrestricted committees for the first three quarters of 2023 and \$22,570.11 for the restricted accounts for a total of \$40,157.66 from our Presbyterian Foundation Funds with the December quarter to add to it.



St. John's members and friends have been very generous in their support, and the Finance Committee thanks you for doing so. We are dedicated to helping fund much-needed repairs on our almost 70-year-old original building.

Once it is approved by Session and the Presbytery's Committee of Ministry (COM), a Congregational meeting will be called to determine the number of members for the Pastor Nominating Committee. Names may be submitted to the Congregational Nominating Committee, which will select a slate for the PNC. At that time, there will be a called Congregational Meeting, which must be announced for two weeks prior to that meeting, to vote on the slate of candidates.

We would like to thank the members of our congregation for their responses to our questionnaire. These have been formatted in two different ways--a listing of the responses and a summarization--and both will be part of the report.

Our thanks also to Pastor Kent and Rev. Sue Taylor, our liaison from COM, for their guidance during this process.

The Missions' Committee aims to ensure that St. John's is an active participant in local mission projects in our Northern Nevada community, international projects, and the ministries supported by Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.). This past year we continued to build upon the groundwork established in prior years. We also strived to better communicate our activities and accomplishments throughout the year to the congregation by frequent presentations during Worship services and by emails. Our hope is to expand these efforts in 2024, identify organizations to which St. John's can make a meaningful contribution, both monetarily and by active participation, and grow the committee with new members.

National and International Mission

St. John's is a strong supporter of the ministries of the larger national and regional Presbyterian Church organizations. The Missions' Committee contributed \$18,000 for Shared Mission Support in 2023 which funds the overall mission and ministry of our Presbytery, our Synod, and the General Assembly Mission Council. In addition, the Per Capita Apportion (\$9,770 for 2023) came from the Mission General Funds. This Per Capita Apportion is based upon the membership of St. John's and is shared among the administrative bodies of the PC (U.S.A.), our Synod, and our Presbytery.

St. John's also collects additional donations from the congregation for three special Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) offerings throughout the year.



The first Special Offering is One Great Hour of Sharing on Palm Sunday/Easter. Donations to OGHS are divided between three programs of the national Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.): the Presbyterian Disaster Assistance, the Self Development of People, and the Presbyterian Hunger Program. This past year St. John's raised \$8,704.56 for OGHS, which included contributions from St. John's Children's Center.







The second Special Offering is the Pentecost Offering which helps the church encourage, develop, and support youth and at-risk children. This year, St. John's raised \$3,673 for the Pentecost Offering. Sixty percent of this amount (\$2203.80) was sent to Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) to support youth ministries of the Presbyterian Mission Agency. Forty percent of the Pentecost Offering is retained to make an impact on the lives of young people in our own community. We chose to designate two organizations focused on helping disadvantaged youth succeed in school as the local recipients of the 40% portion: Project 150 and Youth First. We supplemented the locally retained portion with funds from our Local Mission Fund so that each organization received \$1,000.

The third Special Offering is the Christmas Joy Offering, which raised \$2,029 in 2023 and provides financial support to church workers and their families and education and leadership development for Presbyterian-related schools and colleges.



The St. John's community is very compassionate and responsive to tragedies that occur around the world. Our congregation responded very generously to the devastating earthquake that struck Turkey and Syria on February 6, 2023. St. John's raised \$5,145, which was sent to the Presbyterian Disaster Assistance program of Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) which is uniquely capable of responding to disasters quickly.

A final piece of the National and International missions of St. John's is the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.)-sponsored mission work in Africa by Jeff and Christi Boyd. This husband-and-wife team is based in the Democratic Republic of Congo and serves as Regional Liaison (Jeff) and Regional Facilitator for Women's and Children's Interests (Christi). Jeff supports programs of Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) partners in the Democratic Republic of the Congo, Cameroon, and Equatorial Guinea, such as the establishment of an all-girls Presbyterian school in Congo in 2019. Christi fosters collaborative ministries that transform church and society. From faith-based trauma healing ministries in Congo to a trafficking prevention campaign in Madagascar, she works with partners and their communities who take on issues that perpetuate hardship for women and children. St. John's contributes \$3,000 annually to their Africa mission work.



Local Mission Outreach

Project 150 is a nonprofit located near Reno High School which serves displaced, disadvantaged, and homeless high school youth in Northern Nevada. They operate a boutique where needy students can "shop" for food, clothing, shoes, and toiletries. St. John's donated \$2,500 this year to Project 150 and organized collections of toiletries, food, and gift cards.

We had a unique opportunity this year to sponsor St. John's member, Molly Willoughby, when she was invited to attend a mission trip to Alaska organized by our Presbytery. We used Mission funds to pay her travel and trip cost (\$1,232.03). Molly gave a presentation to the church during a Worship service to share her experience with the congregation.

The needs of many local charities seemed to be especially acute this year. As the Thanksgiving holiday approached, Missions' chose to help two organizations that feed and support the poor and homeless in our community: Catholic Charities of Northern NV and the Eddy House. Each organization received \$1,500 in November. Missions' also decided to use year-end funds to help four local youth-focused charities in December: For Kids Foundation (\$500), Communities in Schools (\$500), The Children's Cabinet c(\$500) and Project 150 (included in the total in paragraph above). In addition, the loose offering at Christmas was supplemented with other funds to donate \$345 to the Food Bank of Northern NV.









The Missions' Committee also strives to support the many independent projects undertaken by other members and committees of St. John's. These include collections of items throughout the year for the residents of Sierra Manor, the backpack project for local schools (we donated \$875.70 towards the purchase of backpacks, and members donated the supplies to fill them), the Crop Walk for Church World Services in October (\$1,927 contributed by St. John's members), Souper Bowl of Caring (\$2,478 donated by St. John's members plus many loads of canned food), and Christmas stockings for Catholic Charities.

Jesus calls us to love our neighbors. The Missions' Committee helps St. John's answer this call as best we can, using the talents and resources with which we are blessed. We could not do our work without the very generous support of our congregation.

The following is the mission statement/goals of the Committee:

Responsible for various technical aspects of St. John's Worship services, including video elements, sounds, recordings, projection, and scheduling of volunteers.

Encourage innovation to better St. John's Presbyterian Church community.

Work with other Committees to achieve related goals.

The Committee's primary responsibility is to provide audio and video equipment and services for the church's Worship services, events, and ministries.

Other responsibilities include managing the TV in the Narthex. This usually displays pictures of the life of the Church and slides containing upcoming events. The remote control for it is missing, but the Committee is working on getting a replacement.

The Committee also maintains the Church website, social media platforms, and the Worship service streaming platform (Christian World Media). The Committee is working on getting the Church a presence on Podcasting platforms such as Apple Podcasts and Spotify.

The Committee consists of three volunteers and two paid staff who serve on a rotating basis to operate the Audio Video (AV) equipment. This includes the slides that are displayed throughout the Worship service, microphones, cameras/live streaming equipment.

The Team meets most months on the first Sunday to go over projects and assign AV duties for the upcoming Worship services that month.

The Committee's main achievements in 2023 were:

- Made continuous improvement operating the AV equipment and Worship service flow through practice and feedback
- Created a kiosk to allow guests, friends, and members to sign in using the Planning Center software
 - ♦ This was tested and had some success, but ultimately it was decided to keep the old method of signing in (pew booklets).
 - ♦ The ROI for the software would have been too low for what it was worth. It was a neat experiment.
- Help with special church services

The Committee's main goals for 2024 are:

- Finish the Podcast implementation project and upload sermons on a regular basis;
 - Utilize the iPad that was used for the kiosk to help with the Worship service.
 - ♦ The idea is to upload the microphone software onto the iPad. This would allow the mics to additionally be managed elsewhere from the balcony.

- Better manage the website;
- Recruit more volunteers/Committee members to help with the AV systems.








Discipleship Mariners


collected Christmas Stockings from our congregation totaling 52 this year in support of needy children in the Reno/Sparks area and distributed through Catholic Charities.







Treasurer's Report



2023 was an exciting year for St. John's, and we have a lot of thank yous to issue. We were finally able to light our parking lot and pave and restripe it. This was a very big project which has been underway since 2022 or even before. A thank you to all the committees and their members, as well as the congregation for helping get this much-needed project finished. Ironclad Electric

was paid \$93,969 for its part of the project, and Nevada Paving was paid \$249,385 for the three aspects of its work. Thank you for your gifts toward our new and much safer parking lot.

We began and ended 2023 financially strong, starting 2023 with a cash balance of \$73,556 and ending the year with \$49,698. Once again, we met our budget without using any of the Unrestricted Funds generated from Endowment Fund interest. Thank you again for your very generous regular giving, which included eight special gifts totaling \$91,500. In addition to thanking you for your generous support, a big thank you goes to our ten committee chairs and members who work throughout the year to monitor their needs and expenses while they carry out God's work through St. John's programs.

Another thank you goes to those of you who regularly give to St. John's Capital Improvement Fund, not to be confused with the 75th Anniversary Capital Fund. Gifts to the SJ's **Capital Improvement fund** are used for non-budget repairs and replacements which are deemed to last more than one year. From this account, we had two major expenditures in addition to some smaller ones:

\$9,750 to replace SJ's 14+-year-old telephone system.

\$6,650 to replace two non-functioning drinking fountains—one in the Narthex and the other in the Children's Center. These new fountains include bottle fillers.

The on-line-giving program, which began during Covid, continues to be used by several members and friends who find it a very convenient way to give. We believe this method of giving will continue to grow.

Each year we are required to have a cash audit of our financial records. Our outside audit was completed in May, and I am happy to report St. John's financial records again met auditing standards.

The Stewardship Program for 2024 was not held until mid-December this year, so 2024 Commitments of Time, Toil, and Treasure are still coming in. At present, we have Treasure commitments totaling \$224,245 which is a decrease of \$9,349 as compared to this time last year. If you have not sent in your 2024 Time, Toil, and Treasure Commitment, it is not too late to do so. Blank forms are available on the Narthex table, or you can send an email to liz@stjohnschurch.org and request the form to be mailed to you. If you prefer, you can go to the St. John's website (www.stjohnschurch.org), click on 2024 Commitment of Time, Toil, and Treasure, and the program will "walk you through the process." Your confidentiality, of course, will be maintained.

We do need every member's help in the area of Per Capita giving. Not familiar with what Per Capita is and why we pay it? St. John's Presbyterian Church is a connectional church with work done, not only here at SJ's but also statewide, regionally, and nationally. In 2023, our Per Capita giving was \$3,179; however, that was only 33% of the \$9,770.40 we were assessed for our share. The remaining \$6,591 was paid out of our general fund in February to take advantage of the substantial discount offered. We are again setting a goal for 2024 to raise that percentage to 50% of the \$7,493.40 Per Capita assessment for which we are responsible. If you have not already sent in your Per Capita amount for this year (\$46 per member, not household), please do so as soon as possible. Thank you for helping with this separate expense each year.

In addition to the thank yous already mentioned, I would like to thank our Financial Secretary, Liz Salas, for the excellent job she does throughout the year maintaining St. John's financial records, providing reports and information to all committees and the Session, and monitoring our whole financial



picture. In addition, another thank you to Maria, SJ's Administrative Assistant, for all she does for us at St. John's. We are very fortunate to have both of them as part of our staff. Thank you Liz and Maria.

Thank you to all of you at St. John's for all your support of the work here at our church. It is a pleasure to be part of the St. John's "family.."
